The Delphi School 2026 is an interdisciplinary educational initiative jointly organized by the Academy of Athens Center for Public Health Research and Education (CPHRE), the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health, and the Delphi Economic Forum (DEF) in association with Kathimerini Newspaper.

The program focuses on the critical interconnections between public health, climate change and food systems, with a particular emphasis on Healthy Aging. It is designed for policy makers, senior executives and professionals who are involved in decision-making processes and require concise, evidence-based and actionable knowledge.

- a short CV
- a brief expression of interest statement (up to 300 words) outlining background, interest, and relevance
